Graduation Evaluation:

When you have three terms remaining (or when you have completed approximately 75-90 credits), your advisor is to provide the Registration Services Office with the GE and Major forms you have filled out. An evaluation of your credits toward your program of study which lists your remaining requirements will be done by the Registrar. This is required to earn the degree.

All students must complete a minimum of 120 credit hours, 40 of which must be at the upper-division level (300-499), to earn the bachelor's degree. (Normally, students begin taking upper division when they become juniors.)
